

## **Screening for Complications of Drug Use**

Function	Screening Ideas	Example Questions	Statistics
Home	Quality of interaction with parent(s) Parenting style (permissive, harsh, balanced) Compliance with rules and consequences	<ul> <li>What do you like about your parent(s)?</li> <li>How are decisions or rules made in your home?</li> <li>How well do you respect your parents' rules or follow consequences?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Teenagers whose parents talk to them regularly about drugs in a pragmatic manner are 42% less likely to use drugs.</li> <li>Only 25% of teens report having these talks.</li> <li>Inconsistency of expectations and follow-through of consequences is a significant risk factor.</li> </ul>
School	Change in grades Bullying Learning Disorders Sudden onset of ADHD	<ul> <li>How are you doing in school?</li> <li>Bullying can be a really big problem. Have you been bullied?</li> <li>Are there any classes that are really hard?</li> <li>Any troubles concentrating or learning new information?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Victimization from bullying increases the rate of drug use by 25-40%.</li> <li>New onset ADHD during pre-teen and adolescent years merits an in-depth assessment for addiction, psychiatric, and/or medical etiology.</li> </ul>
Peers	Changing groups Gangs Sexual activity	<ul> <li>Have you made any new friends? or Who do you like to hang out with these days?</li> <li>What are your thoughts about gangs?</li> <li>Have you been sexually active or thinking about that?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Girls start using through relationships (peers and romantic).</li> <li>Boys start using for sensation seeking and peer pressure: "egg'd on to be THE MAN."</li> <li>Many girls lose their virginity while drunk - and don't use protection.</li> <li>Girls who use are 80% more likely to have sex when young (includes non-consensual sex).</li> <li>Boys who use are 40% more likely initiate sex at a young age.</li> </ul>
Activities	Un-/Structured time Areas of interest	<ul> <li>What do you like to do when not in school?</li> <li>What really catches your interest?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Structured time is essential to reduce risk of substance use.</li> <li>Adult supervision and communication are protective factors and can often enhance participation in extra-curricular activities and interests.</li> </ul>
Well- Being	Mood Sleep	<ul> <li>How happy are you?</li> <li>How much and how well do you sleep?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>50-90% of adolescents with SUD have a co- morbid diagnosis.</li> <li>Predisposition to the effects of substances can mimic a psychiatric disorder.</li> </ul>
